Google Home vs. Amazon Echo: This should be good...

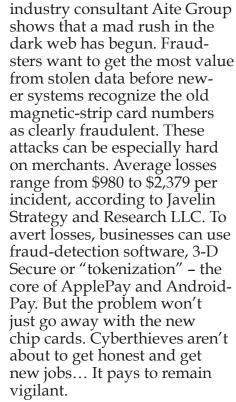
The battle for an always-listening virtual assistant has begun.
